Sterling North Society Presents Raptor Rehabilitator – Dianne Moller

As part of its on-going 20th Anniversary Celebration, the Sterling North Society offers a program sure to entertain the entire family. Dianne Moller – Raptor Rehabilitator, and founder of Hoo's Woods, will provide a live demonstration at the Sterling North Barn, 409 W. Rollin Street, Edgerton, on Sunday August 2, 2009, beginning at 2 pm.

This approximately one hour program will be tailored to the age and experience of the audience. Audience members can expect to learn about the importance of different raptor species, their specially adapted tools, and their roles in our ecosystems. Hoo's Woods' birds include eagles, hawks, owls, falcons, and vulture. They make learning a personal experience and are the best way to present wildlife education.

There is no charge for this event. Refreshments and tours of the Sterling North Home and Museum are complimentary.

Dianne Moller is a licensed educator, falconer, rehabilitator and eagle handler through state and federal agencies. Dianne also serves on the national board of directors for the North American Falconers Association representing falconers in the Great Lakes Region.
